COOPERATIVE LEARNING IDEAS:

Ginnette Serrano held a roundtable discussion here in the TLC at the end of January to share her ideas on the cooperative learning. She participated in a course at Richland which taught creative ways to introduce cooperative learning into the classroom. She started using these techniques and was pleased with the results. Once the census date has passed, she divides her class in to groups of three. She emails the class to let them know the groups have been assigned and to explain that the groups are for the students to encourage each other to finish the class. They will receive 20 bonus points if no one in their group drops. They are to remind their group members of important deadlines and will receive 2 additional bonus points for emailing the group weekly. Lastly the students are to help their group members with assignments and email them first if they have questions concerning the assignment and respond to one another's emails. They will receive 2 bonus points for doing this through out the semester. You can monitor this by requesting the students copy you, the instructor, on each email.

You may wish to outline this fully in an email as well as in an announcement for them to refer and including an example email for them to follow. To manage students' emails, set up folders for each class in Groupwise and have the emails filter into the appropriate folder upon receipt. Then when the time comes it will be easier for you to tally the results and award bonus points as earned. Using this process helps students to communicate with each other, provide necessary encouragement, and gain a little bonus for their final grade. The idea is to also help with retention. If students know they are letting down their entire group by dropping they may be less likely to do so.

Example email used by Ginnette:

Subject: Deadline Approaching

Hello John and Mary,

I am Ginnette. Welcome to the class. I wanted you to be aware that we have a deadline coming up this Friday. You have to turn in your Discussion Board 1. Discussions close on the due date so you will not be able to get your 25 points for the discussion if you miss the deadline.

Please do not hesitate to email me if you need help or have questions about the class. Also, remember we get 20 points for finishing the class, so do not drop!!

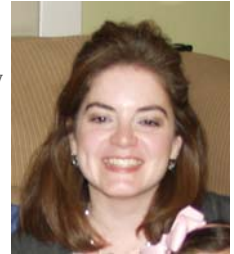
E-MAILING GROUP MEMBERS:

1. Using eCampus,
2. Click on the <Communication> button
3. Click on the "Send email" link
4. Click on "Select Users"
5. Select your group members and me, the instructor
6. Add a subject to the email. You do not need to put the class number or section, this is done automatically by the system.
7. Type the message and make sure to type your name at the bottom of the email.
